This Executive Order is issued pursuant to Sections 1 and 2 of Chapter III of the Standing Orders of the Board of Trustees of The California State University.

Authority to Adopt and Revise Campus Policies

Effective August 4, 1961, the Board of Trustees approved a "Statement of General Principles in the Delegation of Authority and Responsibility" which delegated to the campuses of the then California State Colleges, among other things, the authority to develop and revise from time to

appropriate protocols.

This Executive Order is issued to gather into one document and to highlight the importance of intellectual property rights to the California State University system. A number of developments have combined to encourage this emphasis: the maturing of the California State University as a modern, comprehensive university, changes in information technology, and new emphases in technology transfer as part of the University's mission. In light of this change in equipment, presidents should ensure that compute policies addressing intellectual
