The Secretary shall be a voting member of the Faculty Council. 112 113 114 4.0 Adoption and Amendment of this Constitution 115 116 4.1 This Constitution shall become effective when it has been ratified by a 117 majority vote (ballot) of the Faculty Council and has been approved by the Dean of the University Library and by the Provost. 118 119 120 4.2 Amendment(s) to the Constitution may be proposed by petition of at least 121 twenty percent of the Faculty Council. 122 123 The proposed amendment(s) shall be distributed in writing to Faculty 124 Council members. A meeting of the Faculty Council shall be called for 125 discussion of these proposals at least seven calendar days, but no later than thirty calendar days after the distribution of the proposed 126 amendment(s). This meeting could be part of a regularly scheduled Faculty 127 Council meeting. 128 129 130 Amendment(s) to the Constitution shall become effective upon receipt of a favorable vote (confidential ballot) of a majority of the Faculty 131 132 Council and upon approval by the Dean of the University Library and by the 133 Provost. 134

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
